Fishing is doing fantastic. Not much has change in the past few weeks except for some fishing holes. The Stripers are still on the move and seem to bite in one spot for 2 to 3 days at a time then move to the next spot. The fore bay buoy line is starting to show signs of picking up. The fishermen are still catching them on anchovies, sardines and night crawlers. Most people are fishing for the stripers around 40 to 50 feet but the bigger fish are coming up from deeper waters. The spots on the lake people seem to be catching most of the stripers are near the mouth of Elizabeth canyon, around Sharron's rest and Eucalyptus point, near Trout point and by the buoy line near Suicide point. The Largemouth bass have been doing great on night crawlers and plastics as well as meal worms. We have still been seeing a lot of three to five pounders as well as hundreds of cookie cutter fish which are about one and a half to two pounds. We do ask that people try to practice catch and release fishing when fishing for Largemouth Bass. The moon light fishing did very well this time around. There were lots of largemouth being caught on shore around the marina and the dam. Not too many stripers off the dam but there were quite a few stripers being caught in government cove. The Lagoon fishing is doing very good as well. IT seems to be a good morning bit and a better late evening bite. Around 11:00 pm the fish are feeding like crazy, and we have heard about a few big toads being caught near the spillway.
