The department of fish and game will be stocking the upper lake with catchable sized rainbow trout this week. The largemouth fishing is still doing fantastic as well as the striper fishing. Stripers seem to still be doing best on cut bait at the buoy line and on the dam. Some spots like Sharron's Rest, Kong Island, and parts of Elizabeth Cyn are bringing in bigger stripers, while the buoy line is bringing in high quantities but lower weights. Unfortunately the swimbait bite hasn't been that great at all, and with our chances for plants coming to an end for the season now is our last chance till next season The afternoon bite has been a lot better than the morning bite, this also goes for the largemouth. Largies are being caught on mainly different plastics. Dropshotting a Robo worm is a great way to go at the upper and lower lake. All sorts of colors are working throughout the day but the bite seems to pick up around 5:30 6:00 pm. You can find the largies in most of the coves around the lake and on any shoreline. There are still a lot of bed fish hanging around that can be caught very easily with almost any plastics. Night crawlers are still working to catch largies at the lagoon and the upper lake. The pan fish bite at the lower lagoon has been slowing down a little bit but you can still find them around most of the shoreline and catch them on wax worms and crappie jigs and flys.
